EU regulation and data protection

The AI Act will be finalised in the EU by August 2025 with concrete implementations in the individual countries. Meanwhile, a political battle is raging over how much regulation is necessary. Authors, artists, musicians and publishers are fighting with their collecting societies for an appropriate share of the AI boom. At the same time, public and private areas are being monitored ever more closely with AI-controlled cameras, which raises new data protection issues. Our articles provide an overview of the current state of the debate.
